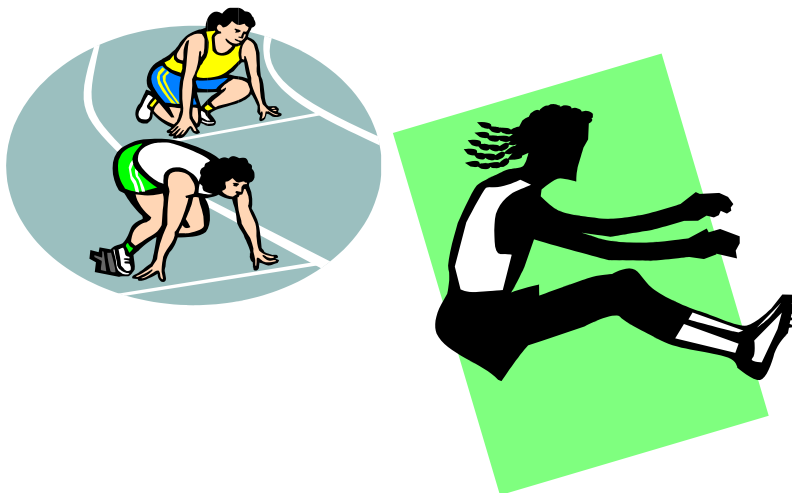

The students from all classes have been actively involved in making art that is currently being exhibited (see details below).

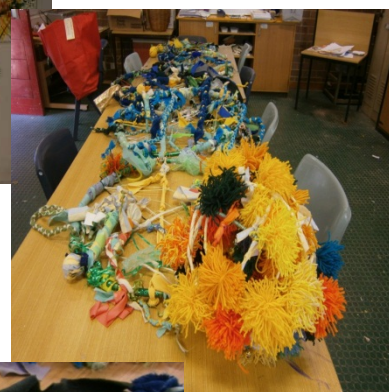

# 2013 Sports Carnival





## *Honeycomb Rocky Road*

600g milk chocolate, chopped

3x50g chocolate-coated honeycomb bars chopped

1 cup mini marshmallows

1 cup of shredded coconut

Place the chocolate in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water and stir until melted. Place the honeycomb pieces, marshmallows and coconut in a large bowl. Pour over the melted chocolate and stir to combine. Spoon into a lightly greased 20cmx30cm tin lined with non-stick baking paper and refrigerate until set. Cut into triangles to serve.
