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TERM 1 OVERVIEW



CLASS 1

In Personal Health and Development we studied Sexual Health, students learnt safe sex practises, unhealthy vs healthy relationships, and sexual expectations in teenage years.

We also visit PUNCHYS every Monday, which is a local gym we have made a community connection with. The boys enjoy participating in either a BARR weights class, or in the cardio circuit room.

Class 1 have been involved in a variety of fun learning experiences this term. We have studied coastal erosion in science this term which involved visiting beaches on our community access excursions and completing assignments on different chemical/ biological weathering landforms and erosion types we had been learning about in the classroom.

Nathan turns 18! All students are completing TAFE this year which is great to see: Horticulture, Retail, and spray painting.

Senior students have been participating in a leadership development program with other schools . On Day 1 over 100 students participated in team building exercises. The boys will work together to initiate a school wide project.



CLASS 2

Class 2 have been learning about measurement in Maths, Electricity in Science Tiny Houses in STEM. We learned about how much living space we needed, created our own house plans and looked at how to make houses fire proof, flood proof and



solar efficient. Everyone's house had to include a bathroom, kitchen, bed and a place to sit and eat.



In Science we learnt about circuits and used a series circuit to power our lighting in our houses, complete with an on-off switch.

Everyone's house is different and students were encouraged to work independently, problem solve and take responsibility for their own materials and equipment.

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CLASS 2

We have also been studying The History of Mongolia and Genghis Khan in History, with our art focus being on Nomadic Art. Students have made plaster moulds, pottery vases and dishes, coins, jewellery and scratch board designs. All students should be proud of their commitment to their studies in these subjects this term.

CLASS 3

As part of the literacy scheme, students construct simple sentences practising fundamental grammatical functions such as using capital letters, full stops, spaces as well as learning about high frequency words.

Students enjoyed playing a variety of board games, in particular, Monopoly, during Friday afternoon activities.

As part of our horticulture program students helped remove weeds and old stumps from garden beds at school. Although a difficult activity, effective teamwork allowed students to accomplish this task.









CLASS 6

As part of Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) students have been learning about computer programming or coding. The school has a set of programmable robots that can be directed to follow codes written on an ipad.

Students focused on making their robot: - move forward 50 cm- burp- turn lights on and off- Dance- Quack!!!!!

CLASS 7

Class 7 had a fantastic first term culminating in an excursion with classes 9 and 6 to Skyzone , Miranda. Students start of their day with a morning fitness routine and thereafter participate in activities in all Key Learning Areas. All students look forward to their community access program on Thursdays. Class 7 students made a series of captivating posters for Harmony Day Celebration. We also engaged in creating some very eye-catching and apt anti-bullying posters. Each class was given a poster and the others were displayed around the school.

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CLASS 8

During term one students in class 8 having been trying hard to get into their new class routines and being with a different group of students. We have been focusing on trying hard with our work and being kind to each other



The students collaborated well with each other during Harmony Day activities to create a wonderful artwork. I have discovered that Class 8 love to paint and it has proven to be a relaxing activity to do at the end of the day. The students did a great job making different colours to create a circles poster.





Our combined Science and Geography theme this term has been 'What A Waste'. We have been learning about the damaging effects of plastics and other materials on our planet. The students and I have enjoyed watching the series "War on Waste' on ABC and discussing topics such as : the effects on the oceans and land of plastic bags and paper coffee cups, food waste and recycling products carefully. Each student completed a poster about Plastics in the environment.

It has been a privilege to welcome new students into the school. We have had a great term and really appreciated the senior students assisting our students with their literacy and numeracy skills.
