Rowan, you continue to amaze us with your commitment to learning and with your knowledge of the Olympics (during lessons?) In Science we have been learning about electric cars and batteries.

Some brain teasers:

Q1. Guess how many individual battery cells are in a Tesla? A. 1000 B. 3000 C. 7000.

Q2. Does an electric car have a radiator (or cooling system) if it doesn't have an engine? Yes/No

Q3. Can you make a torch (that works) using a paper towel roll, 4 D size batteries, some wire, a globe and a switch?
